Vice Chancellor's Report

Welcome to the Annual Report of the University for the year 2021-22. Sri Sri Aniruddhadeva Sports University (SASU) was established by the Government of Assam as a State University with the primary objective to promote education, research and outreach activities in the cusp areas of sports & physical education along with its allied fields. This report is an account of various activities during 2021-22.



Academics: During the 2021-22 session the University completed its first academic program i.e., Post Graduate Diploma in Sports Coaching in Athletics and Football disciplines. Eight candidates successfully completed the diploma program. Due to this course, the University could develop the grading system as per the UGC guidelines and grade cards and transcripts were issued to the successful candidates showing the CGPA. Further, due to starting of this program, an exhaustive Academic Regulation of the University could be prepared. Organizing this course provided the university with an opportunity to develop the functioning of the examination and academic sections of the University with a detailed Standard Operating Procedure (SOP). During this period the services of visiting faculty from Delhi University, Central University of Haryana, NSNIS Patiala, Dibrugarh University and Manipur Central University were obtained to complete its first academic course.

Conferences / Workshops: The University established the Research Forum for sensitizing the research scholars and the faculty towards enhancing the quality of research in higher education institutions. In this aspect, a collaborative webinar was organized on 18th December 2021 by the University in collaboration with Qatar University on the topic "How to publish scientific research in renowned journals - Reviewer's perspective". Around 50 participants across the country participated in the webinar.

Student's activities: During this period students under the guidance of the faculty and staff of the University celebrated many events such as the 75th Independence Day and 73rd Republic Day and Saraswati Puja on 5th February 2022 in the study centre of the University.

Infrastructure: An amount of Rs. 16.3509 Crore was sanctioned by the Government of Assam for the construction of the boundary and landfilling of the university campus site. The work was awarded to the contractor but due to some land dispute, the work could not be started. However, the Dibrugarh administration under the guidance of the Government of Assam is trying to resolve the issue as earlier as possible so that the work could be started. The PWD is in the process of appointing the Consultant for the University so that a detailed DPR could be prepared. However, as per the vision document and the infrastructure plan prepared by the University a prototype design of the entire campus has been developed by the architect identified by the PWD.

Outreach activities: Along with the academic activities, the University is engaged in outreach activities through its Extension Services Cell. The following programs were organized as outreach activities.

SRI SRI ANIRUDDHADEVA SPORTS UNIVERSITY: AT A GLANCE

Sri Sri Aniruddhadeva Sports University is named after a great Vaishnava saint who was a social reformer in Assam during the medieval period. This is the first Sports University of Assam established by the State Government in the city of Chabua, Dibrugarh. The university is focused on quality education in the area of sports sciences, physical education and its allied areas. It was established by the Act of Assam Legislative Assembly (No. LGL. 164/2018/7) which received the assent of the Hon'ble Governor of Assam on 10th December 2018.

The primary aim of this University is to prepare top-tier sports scientists, physical educationists, sports coaches and high-class researchers in the area of sport psychology, exercise science, sports biomechanics, sports medicine, sports physiotherapy, health education, sports technology, and sports analytics. The University intends to prepare professionals as well as sports entrepreneurs keeping in mind the competitive global job market.

The University also plans to create world-level infrastructures for training elite athletes for enhancing medal tallies for India in International sports competitions. At the same time, it intends to reach out to the people of Assam and neighbouring states for garnering untapped talent. Through its outreach programs, the University will be encouraging the masses to be physically active and making sports a way of life. Sri Sri Aniruddhadeva Sports University intends to be at the epicenter of sports development in Assam and help the state contribute to India becoming the sporting powerhouse of the world.

The campus is proposed to be constructed with green buildings for maximizing environmental, economic and social benefits in order to enhance and protect biodiversity and ecosystems with improved air and water quality and reduced waste streams to conserve and restore natural resources.

The University came into force on 22nd June 2020 by the Act No. XXIX of 2018 of the State Legislature of Assam with the effect from the date of joining of the first Vice Chancellor, Prof. J. P. Verma. Sri Sanjoy Dutta, ACS has been posted as the First Registrar of the University on deputation and taken over the charge as new Registrar on 16th September 2020 and the period of the deputation was for one year with effect from 16/9/2020 to 15/9/2021. After the expiry of the deputation of the First Registrar, the present Registrar Sri Partha Pratim Bairagi, ACS has been deputed vide Government notification No. AAA 11/2016/70-A dated 28th September 2021 and Sports & Youth Welfare Department notification No. SYW 121/2020/80 dated 1st October 2021 and has taken over the charge on 4th October 2021.

The University has also been included in the list of the Universities established as per section 2(f) of the UGC Act, 1956 and is empowered to award degrees as specified by the UGC under section 22 of the UGC Act, 1956.

This Annual Report of the University captures the major events and announcements made in the year 2021-22 and also lists other important information with regard to the University during this year.

OBJECTIVES

1. To evolve as an institute of advanced studies in the field of Physical Education and Sports Sciences.
2. To provide for research and development and dissemination of knowledge in Physical Education and Sports Sciences by providing specially designed academic and training programs in various areas of physical education and sports sciences and training in advanced technologies of Sports.
3. To strengthen physical education and sports training programs to promote sports including traditional sports and games.
4. To establish centres and institutions of excellence for imparting state-of-the-art educational training and research in the fields of physical education and sports sciences, sports technology and high-performance training for all sports and games.
5. To provide professional and academic leadership to other institutions in the field of physical education and sports sciences.
6. To provide vocational guidance and placement services in physical education, sports sciences, sports medicine, sports technology and other related fields.
7. To generate capabilities for the development of knowledge, skills and competencies at various levels in the fields of physical education and sports sciences, sports technology and high-performance training for all sports and games.
8. To generate capabilities to provide the infrastructure of international standards for education, training and research in the areas related to physical education and sports sciences, sports technology and high-performance training for all sports and games.
9. To prepare highly qualified professionals in the fields of physical education and sports sciences, sports technology, and high-performance training for all sports and games.
10. To serve as a Centre of Excellence for the elite and other talented sportspersons of all sports and games and innovation in physical education and sports sciences and to carry out, encourage and propagate research.
11. To function as a leading resource center for knowledge and development in the areas of physical education and sports sciences, sports technology and high-performance training for all sports and games.
12. To provide international and national collaboration in the fields of physical education and sports sciences, sports technology and high-performance training for all sports and games.
13. To establish close linkage with sports academies, schools, colleges, sports and recreation clubs, sports associations and international and national federations for the purpose of teaching, training and research in physical education and sports sciences, sports technology and high-performance training for all sports and games.
14. To train talented athletes so as to help them to evolve into elite athletes of the international level.
15. To make Assam become a sporting power.
16. Such other objects, not inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, which the State Government may, by notification in the Official Gazette, specify on this behalf.

The Court

The Court is the apex body of the University and has the following powers and functions:

- (a) To review from time to time, the broad policies and programs of the University and to suggest measures for the improvement and development of the University.
- (b) To consider and pass resolutions on the annual report, audit reports, the annual accounts of the University, and statement of financial estimates for the succeeding year.
- (c) To advise the State Government in respect of any matter which may be referred to it for advice.
- (d) To perform such other functions as may be prescribed by the Statutes.

After the notification of the Statutes of the university by the Govt. of Assam the court has been constituted as per its clause 33(e) by the university through its notification no. SASU/CHB/Court/120/2021/844, dated 01/08/2022. The members shall hold the office for a period of three years except for the Chancellor from the date of issue of the official notification:

Executive Council Meetings

After the notification of the First Statutes of the University by the Govt. of Assam vide No. SYW 73/2021/267 dated 7th October 2021, as per its provisions the full-fledged Executive Council was constituted vide office notification No. SASU/CHB/31/2020/626(A) dated 22/03/2022 which has the members nominated by the Hon'ble Chancellor and State Government. Accordingly, the 4th meeting of the Executive Council was held on 22nd April 2022 with detailed Agenda Items.

Academic & Activity Council Meetings

An Adhoc Academic and Activity Council of the University was constituted by the University vide Notice No. SASU/CHB 30/2020/43 dated 23/09/2020 and accordingly three meetings of the Adhoc Academic and Activity Council were held during the period.

However, after the formation of the full-fledged Academic and Activity Council as per the Statute of the University vide this office Notification No. SASU/CHB 30/2020/434 dated 07/12/2021; the 6th Academic and Activity Council was held on 11th April 2022.

Finance Committee Meetings

The Adhoc Finance Committee (FC) of the University was constituted vide office Notification No. SASU/CHB/32/2020/4 dated 27th October 2020 with a nominee of the Govt. of Assam and accordingly the third meeting of the FC was conducted on 8th April 2022. After the notification of the statute by the Govt. of Assam, the new Finance Committee of the University was constituted vide Notification No. SASU/CHB 32/2020/797 dated 14/07/2022 as per the Statute, with the members nominated by the State Government and Executive Council of the University.

Board of Studies Meetings

Two meetings of the Board of Studies (BOS) were held to discuss various academic matters of the University during 2021-22 (05.06.2021 and 23.03.2022). In the 3rd meeting, discussions regarding starting a Post Graduate Degree Course in Physical Education with the title "Master of Physical Education (MPEd), and starting an Undergraduate Program in Physical Education and Sports with the titled "Bachelor of Physical Education and Sports (BPES) with Multiple exit options as per NEP 2020 were discussed and recommended to the Academic Council for further discussion and approval.

ACADEMIC PROGRAMS OF THE UNIVERSITY

Due to Covid 19 pandemic and limited resources and manpower, the academic program of the University started in the month of January 2021 and was completed in the month of January 2022. The details of the Post Graduate Diploma in Sports Coaching are as follows:

Post Graduate Diploma in Sports Coaching 2021

The total number of students enrolled in the Post Graduate Diploma in Sports Coaching Program during the year 2021 was 9 (nine). Out of 9 (nine), 5 students were from Football Discipline (4 nos. Male and 1 no. Female) and 4 students were from Athletics Discipline (2 nos. Female and 2 nos. Male). The commencement of classes took place on 21st January 2021 and the first semester was completed on 3rd July 2021. Commencement of the second-semester classes took place on 2nd August 2021 and the Second semester practical and theory exams were concluded on 24th December 2021. The students attended a one-month mandatory internship program from 6th January 2022 to 11th January 2022 under various Universities and Associations as detailed below:

The internship Viva-Voce exam was conducted on 17th February 2022. Out of a total of 09 students, 08 students appeared in the End term 2nd-semester exams passing with an average of 7.98 C.G.P.A. Total credits of the program were 46. Out of which 21 credits each were there in both the semesters and 04 credits for the internship program.

The advertisement for the first academic program of Sri Sri Aniruddhadeva Sports University namely Post Graduate Diploma in Sports Coaching (Athletics, Football) was published in the newspapers (The Assam Tribune and The Asomiya Pratidin) on the 8th, 11th, 15th, and 22nd November 2020. Publicity was also done by installing hoardings at prominent places at Dibrugarh and also through online mode well before the starting of online applications. Initially, the starting dates of online applications were kept from 10th Nov. 2020 to 9th Dec. 2020. However, the last date for online application was extended to 23rd Dec. 2020. Notification regarding the extension of the last date was also published in The Assam Tribune on 6th Dec. 2020.

Assessment System

The University prepared the Academic Regulations and accordingly the Post Graduate Diploma in Sports Coaching program was conducted and the assessment of the candidates was made in different courses of the program. The University followed the grading system and issued grade cards in each semester and transcripts after successfully completing the program showing details of credit earned during the course.

STRENGTH OF THE UNIVERSITY

Sanctioned Posts

The Government of Assam has sanctioned 8 posts for Sri Sri Aniruddhadeva Sports University, vide letter no. SYW.305/208/156, dated 6/6/2019.

However, only the post of Vice Chancellor has been filled up so far whereas the Registrar has been deputed from the Government of Assam and Finance and Accounts Officer is on attachment. However, a letter regarding the re-designation of the position of Deans to Professor along with justification has been submitted to the Govt. On 28/06/2022 the Sports & Youth Welfare Deptt. vide letter No. SYW 305/2018/Pt/101 conveyed the approval of the Hon'ble Governor of Assam towards the re-designation of three posts of Dean to Professor. The University has prepared the recruitment rules for teaching and non-teaching positions and got approved by the Executive Council and sent to the Govt. for necessary approval. Once, approved all the sanctioned posts will be filled up.

D. Tree Plantation

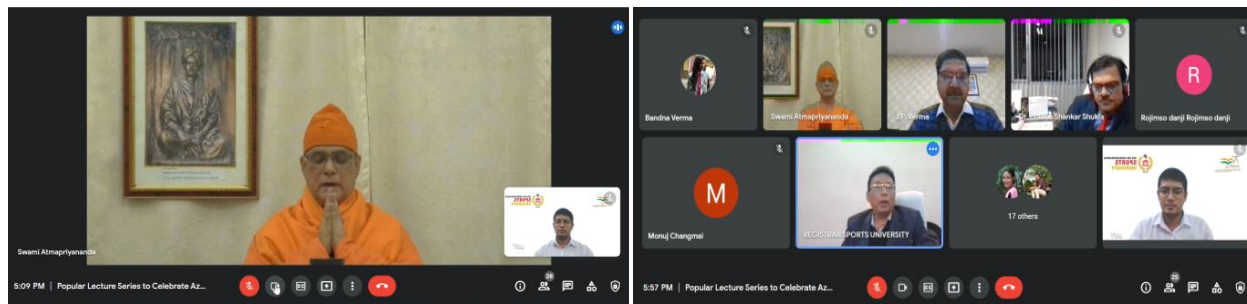
The tree plantation program was planned to plant trees around the office campus of the university during the 2nd week of April 2022.

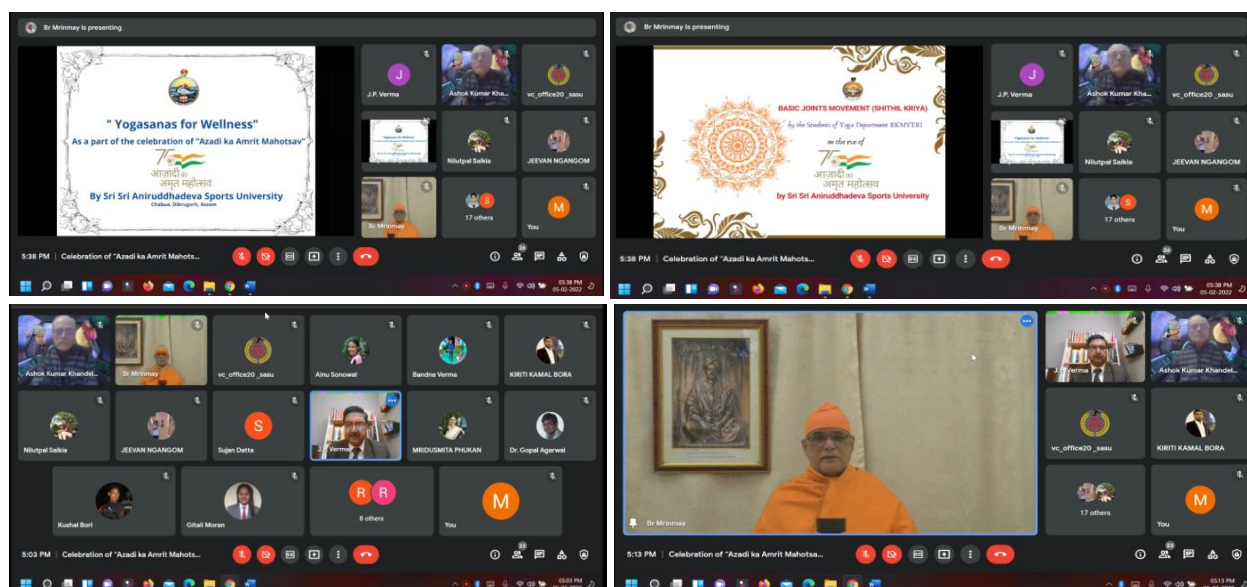

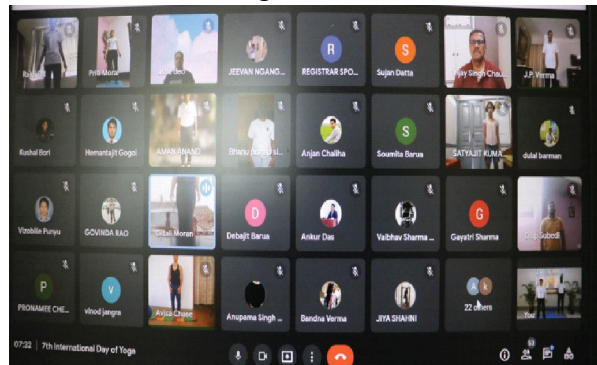

On 21st June 2021, the University celebrated Online International Day of Yoga with the theme "Be with Yoga, be at Home" with the

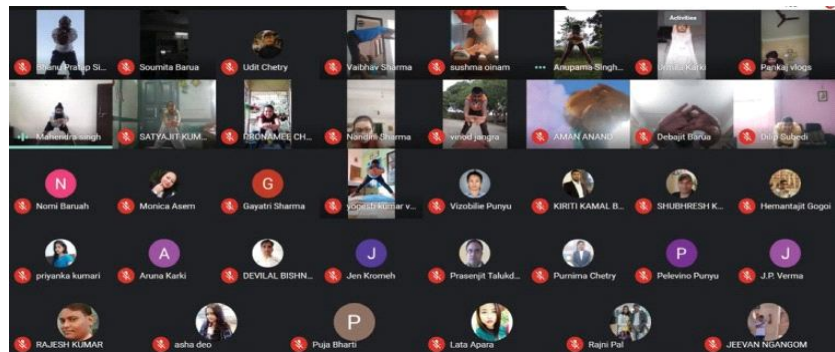

The master plan of this project emphasizes sustainability and environmental sensitivity at all levels. It will further exemplify rational approaches to the construction of a new campus in an unspoiled rural setting. Once completed the campus is likely to emerge as one of the best smart campuses in the State.

Govt. of Assam had approved an amount of Rs. 16.3509 Crore (Rupees Sixteen crore thirty-five lakh nine thousand) only for raising low site (earth filling), construction of boundary wall, Gate, RCC Covered drain, box culvert, and topographical survey works. The Chief Engineer, PWD (Building), Assam already floated a tender for a number of Rs. 14.8 crores, and the same has received a recommendation from the Directorate of Sports & Youth Department vide ref No. T/ BD/22/ 2020/04.
